Spencer, which is responsible for purchasing support programs for appropriated fund (APF) and non-appropriated fund (NAF) food and beverage operations; the Operations Branch, headed by George Miller, which manages the daily worldwide Air Force food and beverage operations and oversees procedures and policy compliance; and the Information Technology Support Branch, headed by Steve Burgess, which is responsible for the business systems used by all food and beverage operations.

The Food and Beverage Division represents the Air Force's modernization of its organizational structure with the combining of APF and NAF food with beverage items into a single food and beverage approach. Realizing a partnership between specific brands and other activities has been an essential element of the long-term strategy to revitalize Air Force food and beverage operations worldwide.
