

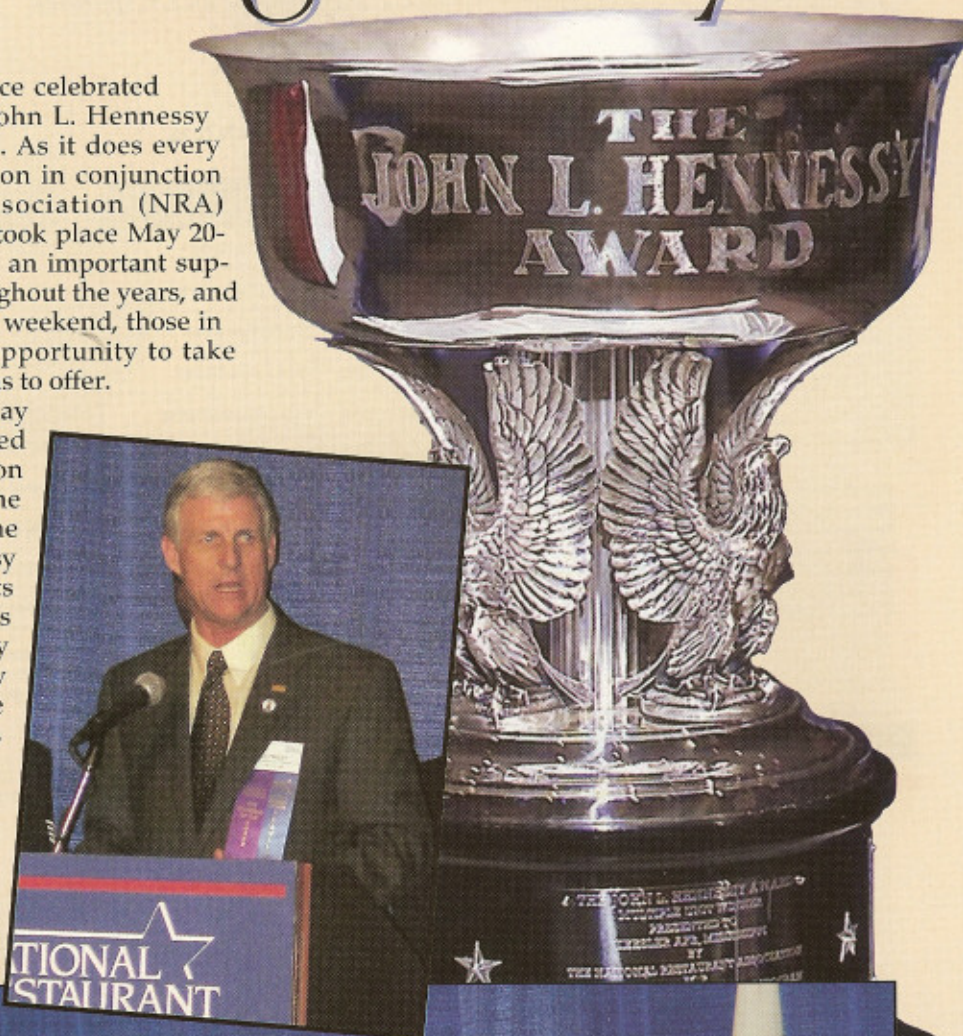
Celebrating in Style

As it does every year, the Air Force held its celebration in conjunction with the National Restaurant Association (NRA) Restaurant Hotel-Motel show, which took place May 20-23 in Chicago, Ill. The NRA has been an important supporter of the Hennessy program throughout the years, and by combining the two events into one weekend, those in town for the awards are given an opportunity to take advantage of all that the NRA Show has to offer.

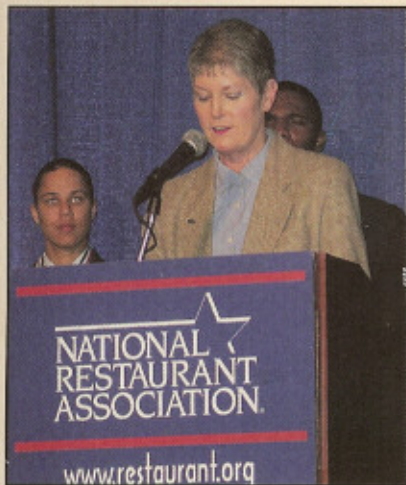
Air Force festivities began on Friday night, May 19, with a reception hosted by the Hennessy Travelers Association (HTA) at the Hilton Chicago. During the cocktail-party event, the HTA took the opportunity to recognize the Hennessy winners, distinguished guests and its many supporters. Representatives from the other branches of military food service, the Defense Supply Center Philadelphia (DSCP), the International Food Service Executives Association (IFSEA) and many food manufacturers and distributors were also invited to attend.

HTA president Carmen Vacalebre was the emcee for the presentations, introducing a number of distin-

guished speakers, including NRA President of the Board Craig Miller, and helping to present the HTA Award of Excellence to two distinguished Air Force Food Service personnel. The winners were Staff Sgt. Cinnamon Calloway, Eglin AFB, Fla., and Staff Sgt. Santiago Padilla, Travis AFB, Calif. Calloway was selected out of a group of four nominees in the multiple-facility category, and Padilla was selected out of five nominees in the single-facility category.

Also during the weekend's festivities, 50 Air Force

Food Service professionals were selected to attend a special educational event at the Culinary Institute of America at Greystone, Calif., in February 2007, made possible by the HTA and its many sponsors, including its partner in this program, Otis Spunkmeyer. In addition, the NRA Educational Foundation will provide each of the nominated servicemembers with a \$2,500 scholarship for their use upon completion of their military service.
